The Service and Outreach Team would like to thank everyone who participated in the Giving Tree for their generosity and thoughtfulness. Thanks to your generosity, we were able to serve 15 children from 8 Melrose families. Each child received toys and clothing that were requested by their family, as well as the family receiving \$100 in grocery gifts cards per child in their family. In addition to these 8 families, we were also able to fulfill gift requests from 40 underresourced teens currently attending Malden High School. All of these gifts were delivered on December 18th by our dedicated team, despite the high wind and rain that we experienced that day.

The Melrose families come to us through the Ames Fund, administered by the Red Cross, which is specifically for Melrose families in need. The teens come to us through the social workers at Malden High School. We were originally connected to this group by John Oteri, when he was serving as Supt of Malden Schools.

#### Martin Luther King, Jr (MLK) Day of Service 2024

On Monday, January 15, 2024, the Melrose Human Rights Commission is hosting an MLK, Jr Day of Service. There are a variety of service projects that community members can choose to participate in. The event is set up to allow people to participate in one project at 10 am and one at 11 am, if they choose to.

On the MLK Day of Service we will have two related projects: 1) making a meal for Bread of Life (appropriate for Middle School and older), and 2) cutting out and decorating cookies for the dessert (appropriate for all ages). We need some specific help in advance of next Monday: volunteer bakers to make sugar cookie dough and gingerbread cookie dough. We need at least 6 batches of cookie dough (each batch should make 2 dozen cookies). 







